

Cookie Policy

At the Consumer Technology Association (CTA)®, we want to ensure that your visit to our website is smooth, reliable and as useful to you as possible. To help us do this, we use Cookies and Simillar Technologies (such as pixel tags, web beacons, clear GIFs, JavaScript, and local storage). We will refer to these Cookies and Similar Technologies simply as "Cookies" for the rest of Notice. We notify you about our use of Cookies and Similar Technologies when you first visit our website, through a notification banner at the bottom of the page. By continuing to use the site, you consent to our use of Cookies and Similar Technologies.

This Notice covers CTA's use of Cookies that may be used in connection with the web sites (including mobile web sites and apps) owned and controlled by CTA (the "Sites").

In some cases, we may use Cookies to collect information that is personally identifiable, or that can become personally identifiable if we combine it with other information. In such cases, our Privacy Notice will apply in addition to this Notice.

What Are Cookies?

Cookies are files containing small amounts of information which are downloaded to the device you use when you visit a website. Cookies are then read by the originating website on each subsequent visit, or another website that recognizes that cookie. Cookies do lots of different and useful jobs, such as remembering your preferences and generally improving your online

These are the different types of Cookies we and our service providers may use on our Sites:

- Essential Cookies. These Cookies are required for the operation of our Sites (for example, to
 enable you to log into secure areas of our web site or use a shopping cart). These Cookies
 enable you to move around the Sites and use their features. Disabling these Cookies will
 encumber the Sites' performance and may make the features and service unavailable.
- Analytics and Customization Cookies. These Cookies allow us to analyze activities on our
 Sites and on other sites where we post content in order to improve and optimize the way our
 Sites work. For example, we may use these types of Cookies to ensure that visitors can easily
 find the information they are looking for on our web sites. One way we do this is to recognize
 and count the number of visitors and see how they move around our web site when they are
 using it. Analytics cookies also help us measure the performance of our advertising campaigns
 in order to help us improve our advertising campaigns and to optimize our Sites' content for
 those who engage with our advertising.
- Functionality Cookies. These Cookies are used to recognize you when you return to our Sites.
 This enables us to personalize our content for you, greet you by name, and remember your preferences (for example, your choice of language or region).
- Advertising Cookies. These Cookies record your online activities, including your visits to our
 Sites, the pages you have visited, and the links and advertisements you have clicked. One
 purpose of this is to help make the content displayed on our Sites more relevant to you.
 Another purpose is to allow us and our service providers to deliver advertisements or other
 communications to you that are designed to be more relevant to your apparent interests.
 When we and our service providers do so, this also involves partners such as publishers, data
 management platforms, and demand side platforms that help to manage the data. For
 example, if you look at one page on one of our Sites, we may cause an advertisement to be
 delivered to you, on our Sites or on other sites, for products referenced on that page or for
 similar products and services. We and our service providers and partners may also append
 other data to information collected by these Cookies, including information obtained from
 third parties, and share this information with third parties for the purpose of delivering ads to
 you.

Information from Cookies?

We and our service providers may use Cookies for a variety of purposes, including to:

- · Help us and third parties obtain information about your visits to the Sites;
- · Process your orders;
- · Analyze your visiting patterns to improve our Sites;
- Deliver advertising, communications, and content from us and third parties, on our Sites and those of third parties, specific to your interests;
- · Remember your language and other preferences:
- · Help you obtain information you are looking for;
- · Provide a safe and secure service for online transactions;
- Measure how many people use our Sites, and how they use them, to keep our Sites running
 efficiently and to better understand our Sites' audiences.

If you register on one of our Sites, or otherwise provide us with your personal information, we may associate that information with other information we collect from or about you or that you provide, information regarding your use of our Sites, or information we receive from or about you from third parties. We will use this combined data for marketing and analytics purposes.

How Long do Cookies Stay on My Device?

Some Cookies operate from the time you visit a CTA site to the end of that particular web browsing session. These Cookies expire and are automatically deleted when you close your Internet browser. These Cookies are called "session" Cookies.

Some Cookies will stay on your device between browsing sessions—they do not expire when you close your browser. These Cookies are called "persistent" Cookies. The length of time a persistent Cookie stays on your device varies from Cookie to Cookie. We and others use persistent Cookies for a variety of purposes, such as to store your preferences so that they are available for the next visit, and to keep a more accurate account of how often you visit our Sites, how often you return, how your use of the Sites may vary over time, and the effectiveness of advertising efforts.

What If I Don't Want to Accept Cookies?

Although you have to consent to our use of cookies, as noted above, you can set your browser in such a way that you are informed about the placement of cookies and only allow cookies in individual cases, exclude cookies for specific events or automatically delete cookies. If you disable or limit the use cookies, the functionality of our website may be limited.

You can also use a browser plug-in such as Ghostery* from Cliqz International GmbH. (A browser plug-in is a piece of software which adds extra capabilities to your browser—for example, to play video or scan for viruses.).

If you choose to opt out, you won't necessarily see fewer ads. However, the ads you see may be less relevant to your interests.

Who Puts the Cookies on My Device?

Cookies may be placed on your device by CTA as the Site operator. These Cookies are called "first party" Cookies. Some Cookies may be placed on your device by a party other than CTA. These Cookies are called "third party" Cookies. For example, a CTA partner may place a third party Cookie to enable online chat services.

Cookies may also be used to allow us and third parties to know when you visit our Sites, and to understand how you interact with e-mails, advertisements, or other content. Through Cookies, aggregate and other information not identifying individual users (such as your operating system, browser version, and the URL you came from, including from e-mails and advertisements) may be obtained and used to enhance your experience and understand traffic patterns. This technology counts the number of users who visit a particular service from specific banner advertisements outside the CTA Site or who clicked on links or eranhirs included in e-mail neweletters received

from CTA. It is also used as a tool to compile aggregated statistics about how CTA Sites are used, to perform analytics and help us to optimize our Sites, and to help serve you advertising based on your interests, as described in further detail below.

Third-Party Cookies Used on Our Website

Advertising

Double-Click Floodlight cookies enable us to understand if you complete certain actions on our website(s) after you have seen or clicked through one of our display/ video advertisements served on Google or other platforms via Double-Click or other advertising platforms including The Trade Desk, AppNexus, Amazon DSP, and Google DV 360. These services serve an anonymous, unique identifier which is used to track how successful our advertising is and to understand the content with which you have engaged on our website(s) so they may subsequently deliver some targeted advertisements to you.

Affiliate Management

Visitors to our website may click on a link that contains tracking information that allow our partners, such as Airbnb, to ensure that referrals are properly attributed to CTA and we may receive compensation for these referrals.

Cookie Management

Visitors to our website are advised via a pop-up message about the cookies that we use and directed to this page if they would like more details. This cookie from Cookie Script remembers that the customer has accepted the cookie consent banner. It's stored in the user's browser and means you don't see the banner again. This site also uses Google Tag Manager which is a tag management system that allows for the management and updating of all the other cookies/tags noted in this policy.

Email Analytics

Litmus Analytics and Salesforce Marketing Cloud may be used with our marketing email messages to track the success (email opens, clicks on links) of these messages. Personal information is stored in Salesforce Marketing Cloud if our customers complete a form for registration to events, contact/request forms or for subscription to our email communications. Non-personal information such as IP address, operating system, web browser, and pages visited is gathered by both Litmus Analytics and Salesforce Marketing Cloud.

Facial Recognition

We may use Google Vision on our websites that ask event attendees to upload a photo for their event badge for security purposes. This is used solely to identify if the photo contains an image of a human face. We store the photo that the attendee has uploaded and the facial recognition only adds a Yes/No answer as to whether the photo contains an image of a human face.

Form Security

We may use Google reCAPTCHA ("reCAPTCHA") on our websites. The purpose of reCAPTCHA is to check whether data have been entered on our websites (e.g. in a contact form) by a person or by an automated program. This is to protect our website from fraudulent automated spying and from spam.

Location Analytics

Our mobile application includes functionality which allows our attendees to identify their location at the event. Application users choose to use the application anonymously or to login as an identified user in which case the personal data provided upon registration may be used. Non-personal information, such as IP address, device ID and location, is gathered.

This website uses targeting cookies from the Facebook, Twitter and Linkedin remarketing services to advertise our content, products and services on these social media channels to previous visitors to our site. Any data collected will be used in accordance with our own privacy policy and the social network's privacy policy.

Survey Analytics

Some customers may receive a survey from us that uses Qualtrics or Survey Monkey. These surveys are emailed to select customers who complete a form for registration to events or use one of our products and services. Your survey responses will be matched with personal information that you provided when registering or purchasing.

Multimedia Content

Brightcove and YouTube are used to deliver video content on our website. We may also use Libsyn to allow our podcast player to display and function on the site. Their cookies gauge the bandwidth of your internet connection so they can optimize the video display and also identify unique users so they can personalize your experience based on previous video usage.

Website Analytics

Crazy Egg and Google Analytics collects information about how visitors use our site. We use the information to compile reports and to help us improve the site. The cookies collect information in an anonymous form, including the number of visitors to the site, from whence visitors have come to the site, and the pages they visited.
